The Morris Brothers are country boys, growing up on a farm in North Georgia. Their father, Frank Morris, was a Baptist preacher. He pastored their home church, Wahoo Baptist Church, one of north Georgia's oldest, and largest country churches. It was established in 1819. Brother Frank, as he was known, was called to pastor Wahoo at the age of 24, and pastored until his death at 49. He was also a very good musician and singer, so Homer and Herb, were exposed to the kind of music they make from the day they came into this world. Their mother, Ella, was the bedrock of their home. She always supported her husband in the ministry of the gospel, as well as the music he loved. Her love, was demonstrated daily by teaching her children to always love, and work to obey our Lord, and to work hard, to be the best they could be with their music.

To God Be The Glory Great Things He Has Done

In 1927 Rev. Frank Morris formed the Morris Family. It was known as country's first gospel singing group. The group was made up with Rev. Frank Morris on mandolin, His sister Fanny Lou on the guitar, and Homer and Herb's oldest sister, Girlie Jean on the banjo, who was only 8 years old at the time. They had a weekly program at WTFL in Toccoa, Georgia, and WSB, a 50,000 watt giant in Atlanta. They became very popular throughout the southeast. On March 19, 1930 they recorded their first session for Vocalion Record Company in Atlanta. Their music was released nationally late spring of that year. Rev. Morris continued to work with his children, teaching them to sing and play different instruments. As the boy's grew they begin harmonizing together, and are still going strong today. They are most thankful for their upbringing, and are looking forward with great joy, when the family will all join in song again, around God's throne.

Homer and Herb are so very thankful for their many friends all over the world. As you know, most musical groups, including gospel music, refer to their listeners and friends as fans. Homer and Herb will tell you that they don't have fans, they have friends. They are not, and have never been entertainers. They carry a simple message in song to bring Joy, Hope and Peace to those who listen to their music.

The Morris Brothers are the

last of the brother duets still active. They have recorded many songs, over 20 albums. Their music is heard on radio stations all over the world. They have been honored by their friends many times, including induction into the traditional Country Music Hall Of Fame. Their music is constantly high in the national and international music charts. For this they are very thankful, from the bottom of their hearts. DJ's, thank you so very much for playing and charting our music. You mean everything to us. We love you, and you are all in our prayers daily.

Homer and his wife, Pauline, now reside in Acworth, Ga. They have 2 sons, Kent and Phillip, and 3 grandchildren. Kent and Phillip were members of The Morris Brothers band for a long period of time. Herb and his wife, Virginia, reside in Marietta, Ga. They have 3 children, Ron, Donna, and Randy. They have 5 grandchildren. None of Herb's children have been members of the Morris Brothers band. The Morris Brothers are determined, by the grace of God, to continue recording, and filling their concert dates, as long as they retain good voice quality, which has made them unique, and produced that distinctive sound in country bluegrass music, which is unmistakably The Morris Brothers.
